

Comparison of Joe's Statements
With the Physical Evidence

Joe's Statements During Interrogations and Testimony	Physical Evidence Found at the Crime Scene or During the Autopsy
Joe said that he and Danial performed various sexual acts with Ms. Bosko and that Joe had ejaculated in Ms. Bosko's mouth.	Only Ballard's DNA was found at the crime scene, and no foreign DNA was found in or around the victim's mouth.
Joe said that Ms. Bosko bit his penis.	There was no foreign DNA in or around the victim's mouth.
Joe said that he slapped Ms. Bosko across the face.	There were no welts or bruises on Ms. Bosko's face.
Joe said that the crime occurred in the living room.	The crime occurred in the bedroom.
Joe said that it was possible that Danial moved the body.	There is no evidence that her body was moved.
Joe said that he pinned her shoulders down.	There were no bruises or injuries to suggest such restraint.
Joe said the crime occurred between 7:00 -8:00 pm.	The crime occurred after 11:00 pm.
Joe could not describe the knife.	The knife had a brown handle with ridges and was 4-5 inches long.
Joe did not know what part of Ms. Bosko's body was stabbed.	She was stabbed in the chest.
After he was shown a picture of the victim and crime scene, Joe said that he and Danial covered Ms. Bosko with the blanket.	William Bosko covered his wife with the blanket after finding her dead.
Joe stated that he, Danial, and Eric Wilson raped Ms. Bosko.	Only Ballard's DNA was left at the crime scene.
Joe stated that Eric held a knife to Ms. Bosko's throat during the rape.	No evidence of blade or knife-point abrasions on neck.
Joe said that he, Danial, and Eric tried to move the body out of the bedroom, but backtracked when they heard the sound of a car.	No evidence, such as blood in the hallway or living room, to suggest that Ms. Bosko's body was moved after she was stabbed.
Joe stated that Eric brought the knife to Danial's apartment and cleaned it.	The knife was found next to Ms. Bosko's body and was bloody.
Joe said that he, Danial, Eric, "George Clark," (who he later agreed was Derek Tice) and two other men entered the apartment, dragged the victim down the hall to her bedroom and committed the crime.	No disturbance in the apartment to suggest that 6 men were present. For example, papers precariously perched on a shelf in the narrow hallway were undisturbed.
Joe stated that six men stabbed Ms. Bosko.	The stab wounds, which are all at the same depth and angle, and within inches of each other, were inflicted by one person.
Joe stated that one of the suspects covered the peephole of Ms. Bosko's door and that she opened it to see who was there.	Ms. Bosko was nervous and cautious when she was home alone and would not have opened the door without being able to see who was there.
Joe said he was the last to hold the knife, and it was not bent.	The knife was bent.
Joe stated that some of the men may have listened to a CD in the living room after the crime was committed.	No fingerprints on the CD or stereo.
